

Around the Ringsoak had some lovely successes at the

fall CKC Agility Trials. Along with Steeplechase and Master Jumpers Q's, she earned her AGN (Agility Novice) and her XP (Excellent Points and Distance) Titles. She also tossed a CGN Title in for fun.

RIO

Rio and I entered virtual trials in rally this fall through CARO (Canadian Association of Rally Obedience), which is fairly similar to CKC Rally. He had already earned his Novice title virtually through them in the spring, so we entered three Advanced trials. I'm happy to report that he not only passed all three rounds that I submitted, but earned perfect scores of 200 for each round, earning a new title.



Our work isn't flawless since some criteria such as heeling position are more relaxed than for CKC competition obedience, but it does mean that he and I performed all the essential criteria for each exercise without mistakes. I'm happy with how our teamwork is progressing! Virtual trials have given me concrete training goals while we work towards being ready to enter inperson trials, and I like getting feedback from judges and the sense of achievement of earning titles.

CARO has some differences from CKC that I like. They allow food rewards in the ring for a few stations in Novice and Advanced, so it's a very nice way to gradually taper off reinforcements in the ring. They also have special additions to their titles for good scores: CL for cum laude if the average of the 3 Q's is 180-190 and MCL for magna cum laude if the average is 190-200. Rio's full title is therefore CRAMCL. Quite the alphabet soup!

MINT

After obtaining her ATD (Advanced Trick Dog) and NTD-M (Novice Trick Dog Masters) Titles in November 2021, we anxiously awaited the agility trials at the AKC Summer Classic/ GRCC National! The day before the trial started Mint went into season. Wanting to accomplish something this year, we had her try dock diving. She ended up earning her DS (Dock Senior) Title! Dock diving was a great work out for her hind legs as we were having issues with her knocking down bars during agility training, plus she just LOVED the sport (can't wait for the pool to open at Wet Noses)!



Mint then went on to earn her AGN (Agility Novice) as well as her JT (Jumps & Tunnels) Ttles at the Rocky Mountain Working Herding Club of Alberta agility trials at Wet Noses in September. A week later, she went on to earning her AGNJ (Novice Jumpers with Weaves) and NP (Novice PAD) Titles at the LDKC Agility Trials. The following weekend she earned her CGN (Canine Good Neighbour) Title. We've had all her health testing done in 2021 & 2022 (eyes, thyroid, genetics) and we're thankful all is clear. Her hip/elbow X-rays have been done and do look good, but still needs to be evaluated by OFA veterinarians. If you haven't had your dog's health testing done yet, what are you waiting for? Luke had a lot of fun in 2022! Here are the highlights.

He started the year with a Reserve Winners Dog and Best of Winners in the AKC conformation ring, wagging his big tail non-stop. I thought it was a great accomplishment that he kept his feet on the ground as Luke greets everyone with so much enthusiasm. Luke also earned his Certificate of Conformation Assessment, and the three evaluators had very nice things to say about him.

Luke's favorite sport is the field, and he debuted in UKC by going 4 for 4 to earn his Started Hunting Retriever title (the equivalent of the AKC Junior Hunter). Two of the tests were run in 100°F, and the hardest part was convincing Luke to come out of the cool ponds with his duck.

We went on Luke's first long road trip, from Oregon to the GRCA national in Michigan. Luke evidence indicates Goldcker breeds quality golden retrievers! For us, things are looking up, and the relationship with Mint is deepening further!

loved seeing new places, and noshing on regional snacks (local sausages and Amish fry pies were among his favorites). He also earned a new nickname, "Scout", as he loved to watch where we are going in the truck.



At the GRCA National, Luke earned his first JH leg and his Working Certificate. The Junior Hunter test was difficult, with high cover and long marks; half of our flight went out on the land series. Luke had a long hunt on his second water retrieve, but he was not coming back without his duck and he kept searching in the

reeds and shadows until he found it. At the WC test, Luke handled the double really well EXCEPT for almost bypassing me with Duck 1 and going to pick up Duck 2 on the same trip! I really don't want to find out if he can fit two ducks in his mouth at the same time. Thankfully, Luke came when I called him!

To finish out the year, Luke earned his Tracking Dog title, covering 465 yards and four turns in three minutes! The judges and the spectators said it was one of the fastest tracks they've ever seen. It was certainly the fastest track I have ever RUN!

Oh, and Luke went to his first agility match! We did four runs, and it started pretty wild! But by the last run, Luke was running short sequences, including twelve weave poles and sticking his contacts. Good job, Baby Boy!

KASPER

I could not be happier with Kasper's achievements in 2022. He is an amazing partner, so intuitive, driven, athletic, and so very handsome! I thank Lori Lancaster,



Lori Copsey, and Nancy Lewis for blessing me with this outstanding boy every single day.

Kasper's year started in mid-December 2021, winning the Novice Division of the AKC Classic in Orlando, Florida. This is the most distracting and competitive venue that AKC offers and Kasper won each of his three classes with a 199, 199, and 199.5 to top the field of excellent dogs and handlers. In April, Kasper was featured in Front and Finish Magazine as the top AKC

Novice dog of 2021 which was an amazing honor considering the dogs that were also in Novice at that point all across the country. He also achieved his DS-AKC Dock Senior title at that show as well.



Kasper finished his CDX and UD in fine form with several more High In Trials just before we left to show at the Classic in December 2021. Those High In Trials achieved his entry in to the Golden Retriever Club of America Obedience Hall of Fame. I didn't start showing in Open B

and Utility B (working towards his UDX and OTCH) until February. We normally do about 2 show weekends a month—so about 4 trials per month. We did not show in March or in June as I was in Florida visiting my daughter and son-in-law, and we did not show in August due to our trip to Canada. In just 6 months of showing in a very competitive area, Kasper achieved his UDX and then his Obedience Trial Championship!

Kasper finished out 2022 with 18 AKC High In Trials and 2 Canadian High In Trials, and 14 High Combined awards. He is currently listed as #10 Golden for HITs in the USA. Kasper has had multiple 199.5 scores in both Open B and Utility B. We again competed at the AKC Classic just a few weeks ago in Orlando, this time in the extremely competitive Master Division. Being still very inexperienced in both of these classes, especially in a very distracting venue, my goals were to qualify in every exercise and to finish in the Top 25 of all the dogs entered there. I knew these were very lofty goals but I have such faith in Kasper as a teammate, I wanted to shoot for it. We more than achieved these goals by qualifying in every ring and every exercise, and by finishing #14 overall. We had a couple tough Utility rings with Go Outs that looked very different from what he is accustomed to and we lost some points on no-sits on Go Outs in those rings. These are common "green" dog mistakes and we would have placed in the Top 10 easily.

I don't show in the Conformation ring, but many people have encouraged me to enter Kasper in Conformation. So I entered him in a CCA—GRCA Certificate of Conformation Assessment in April. He aced all three judges and received his CCA

certificate receiving very nice remarks from all three of the judges.



Kasper is truly a once in a lifetime dog. He is so sweet, so smart, so intuitive, and very handsome. He has a funny, quirky sense of humor and loves to smile. I cannot tell you how proud I am to hold the end of his leash! Many thanks to Lori for making this breeding happen and blessing me with Kasper!
